WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Patients with advanced heart disease or lung disease who have any two of these symptoms:

Heart Patients

- Symptomatic despite optimal treatment with diuretics and vasodilators
- Recurrent congestive heart failure
 - ejection fraction < 20%
- New York Heart Association Class IV Disease
- Supporting factors of:
 - Arrhythmias resistant to treatment
 - History of cardiac arrest or resuscitation
 - History of unexplained syncope
 - Cardiogenic embolic disease (cerebrovascular accident, CVA)

Lung Patients

- Severe chronic lung disease
 - Disabling dyspnea at rest, poorly responsive to bronchodilators
 - FEV1 after bronchodilator <30%
- Progression of advanced pulmonary disease
 - Recurrent pulmonary infections
- Hypoxemia at rest, on room air: pO2 < 55mmHg or O2 sat <88%
- Right heart failure secondary to pulmonary disease
- Unintentional progressive weight loss > 10%
- Persistent resting tachycardia
